- Entries accepted Thursday, August 4, 6 - 8 PM; Friday, August 5, 7 - 8 AM. Exhibit Bldg, "A", South Entrance. (Admission charged at fair gate).
- Judging is Friday morning. **In order to keep the judges and county fair office on schedule, all entries MUST be registered by 8:00 AM Friday morning.**
- If known, identify variety of flower on entry. **PRE-REGISTRATION IS STRONGLY ENCOURAGED.**
- Plastic bottles, colored glass bottles or bottles with labels are not allowed. Please try to provide your own bottle(s). Crystal vases are not necessary.
- Flowers are judged solely on the condition of the specimen. Bloom(s) in each entry should be uniform in color, shape, size, and maturity. Leave foliage/leaves on stem but leaves/foliage should not be submerged under the water in the bottle.
- Identify the Genus/Species of plant, if known. Properly named specimens will receive ribbon preference.
