To save time on entry day, please pre-register by July 30. Your entry tags will be ready to pick up in Bldg. B when you bring your exhibits.

- The number of articles of each variety in each lot MUST be complied with
- All farm crops must be correctly labeled with the domesticated species and variety of plant on each lot entry
- Exhibitors are limited to one entry per lot

**EXHIBITORS – For your safety, when bringing exhibits to the fair, please park and enter the south end of the exhibit building.**

### CLASS 1 — CORN (last year's crop)

#### Lots below Premium Code B

1. Yellow Hybrid, 80-89 days 10 ears, remove husks
2. Yellow Hybrid, 90-94 days 10 ears, remove husks
3. Yellow Hybrid, 95-99 days 10 ears, remove husks
4. Yellow Hybrid, 100-104 days 10 ears, remove husks
5. Yellow Hybrid, 105-115 days 10 ears, remove husks
6. Yellow corn, open pollinated, 10 ears, remove husks
7. Sweet corn, 10 ears, remove husks
8. Popcorn, 10 ears, remove husks
9. Shelled corn, 4 quarts
10. Ornamental corn, 5 ears, husks left on
11. Not specified, 10 ears, husks off

### CLASS 2 — GRAIN (4 quarts)

#### Lots below Premium Code B

1. Spring Wheat
2. Winter Wheat
3. Oats, any variety
4. Barley, any variety
5. Rye, any variety
6. Soybeans, early variety
7. Soybeans, medium variety
8. Soybeans, late variety
9. Sunflowers, any variety

### CLASS 3 — GRAIN SHEAVES (this year's grain)

- Samples to be shown in sheaves of full length, tied tightly, measuring 3 inches across the bottom (diameter).

### CLASS 4 — FORAGE (this year's)

- Samples shown cured, as for hay in small bale approximately 18 x 18 inches, loosely tied twice (similar to regular bale).

5. Reed's canary grass
6. Sudan grass

### CLASS 5 — POTATOES

- Each lot must contain 10 tubers of specified variety, uniform in size (Washing permitted, but do not blemish skin by scrubbing)

### CLASS 6 — CROP ART

- Artistic Crop Art using seeds, stems etc. in natural colors on supporting background and excluding paints and dyes of any kind.
- Framing optional but must appear finished over all.
- Maximum dimensions: 24 x 40 inches, 30 inches diameter.
- Bring 4 x 6 inch card identifying materials used.

#### Lots below Premium Code A

1. Crop Art – Ages 12 yrs. and under
2. Crop Art – Ages 13 – 17 yrs.
3. Crop Art – Ages 18 yrs. and over
